Much of our substance abuse prevention work stems from intergenerational trauma and present day trauma. It is important for preventionists to understand trauma and how it contributes to many public health issues. Knowledge is power and this training will provide the opportunity to learn about how trauma impacts all aspects of life and lends explanation as to why many children and families we strive to help do the things they do. A practical overview of basic brain function and impact of trauma on the brain's organization, function and structure, and current research will be provided. Participants will explore the struggles preventionists may encounter and practice recognizing and responding to children and families. Activities and methods to incorporate into the way you work in the community will also be reviewed.
