## Youth Risk and Resiliency Survey (YRRS)

Biennial survey of middle and high school students in New Mexico

Administered in collaboration between NM schools / school districts, NM Public Education Department (NM PED), UNM Prevention Research Center (UNM PRC), and NMDOH

Design and support from the Centers for Disease Control and Prevention (CDC)

Analysis in collaboration with NMDOH and UNM PRC

Paper survey

Administered in odd-numbered years

Reports available in even years

Weighted to assure that it is representative of the NM population

## Behavioral Risk Factors Surveillance System (BRFSS) Survey

Annual national survey that collects state data about adult U.S. residents regarding their health-related risk behaviors, chronic health conditions, and use of preventive services

World's largest, on-going telephone health survey system operated by the Centers for Disease Control

The core national survey is used to gather information on many health behaviors and takes about 27 minutes to complete; however, the only questions about substance use are about alcohol, tobacco, and cannabis

NMDOH accepts proposals to include additional modules in the survey deployed in our state

## Substance Use Epidemiology Profile

The Substance Use Epidemiology Profile is prepared annually by the New Mexico Department of Health Epidemiology and Response Division, Substance Use Epidemiology Section. It is currently funded through the Substance Abuse and Mental Health Services Administration (SAMHSA) and Centers for Disease Control (CDC) Alcohol Prevention Program. Its production is guided by the Statewide Epidemiological Outcomes Workgroup (SEOW)

#### Organized into three parts:

#### 1. Consequences

-Includes Alcohol-Related Death, Smoking-Related Death, Drug Overdose Deaths, and Suicide

#### 2. Mental Health

- Includes adult and youth mental health measures

#### 3. Consumption

- Alcohol, Illicit Drugs, Tobacco

### NM-IBIS

NM-IBIS is an online database developed and maintained by the New Mexico Department of Health. NM-Ibis provides public access to NM health data including data related to substance use and misuse, overdose, and mental health indicators from the YRRS and BRFSS. #### NM-IBIS contents:

"Health Topics" tab provides quick access to data by topic

- Community Profiles provide data at-aglance for each New Mexico county
- Indicator Reports provide data charts and maps for health indicators, such as teen births, smoking rates and drug overdose deaths in New Mexico
- <u>Custom data queries</u> allow you to query public health datasets

## NM Drug Overdose Prevention Quarterly Measures Report

- Report produced quarterly to track indicators related to drug overdose prevention. The indicators reported here allow for the tracking of three key interventions for prescription drug overdose: improving prescribing of controlled substances, increasing the availability of treatment for opioid dependence, and the increasing availability of naloxone in the community
- Report indicators published at the statewide level, but indicators are available at the county level by request

## National Survey on Drug Use and Health (NSDUH)

#### SAMHSA funded survey that measures:

- use of illegal drugs, prescription drugs, alcohol, and tobacco and misuse of prescription drugs
- substance use disorder and substance use treatment major depressive episode and depression care
- serious psychological distress, mental illness, and mental health care
