  - Response rate = 74%



  - oResponse rate = 70%






## Highest Level of Resiliency Factors by High-Risk Groups, Grades 9-12, 2019, NM

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






## Race/ethnicity of Students Born Outside the U.S. Middle School and High School, NM, 2019




# Nativity by Race/Ethnicity, Middle School and High School, NM, 2019















# Non-English Language Spoken at Home among Foreign-born Students by Race/ethnicity, High School, 2019, NM




### Current Cigarette Smoking by Nativity and Language Spoken at Home, High School, 2019, NM




### Current Marijuana Use by Nativity and Language Spoken at Home, High School, 2019, NM






### Experienced Sexual Violence by Nativity and Language Spoken at Home, High School, 2019, NM




#### Homeless Students

  - During the past 30 days, did you ever sleep away from your parents or guardians because you were kicked out, ran away, or were abandoned? (Yes/No)






# Homelessness by Grade Level, Middle School and High School, 2019, NM




# Homelessness by Age, Middle School and High School, 2019, NM






### Grades Earned by Homelessness Middle School and High School 2019, NM











#### Kicked Out, Ran Away, or Were Abandoned by High Risk Characteristics Grades 9–12, 2019, NM






#### Homeless: Accompanied and Unaccompanied by Parents, Grades 9-12, 2019, NM







#### Physical Disabilities or Long-Term Health Problems


- Do you have any physical disabilities or longterm health problems?
  - (Long-term means 6 months or more.)

  - Risks that confront these students.

  - Race/ethnicity
  - Parent education (Socio-economic status)


#### Physical Disabilities or Long-Term Health Problems by Race/Ethnicity, High School, NM, 2019




#### Physical Disabilities or Long-Term Health Problems by Parent Education, High School and Middle School, NM, 2019











    - This will be clarified in the question we ask in 2021.






## Sexual Identity by Sex Grades 9–12, 2019, NM




## Sex of Sexual Contacts by Sexual Identity, Grades 9–12, 2019, NM














#### Gender Identity


### Homeless: Accompanied and Unaccompanied by Parents, Grades 9-12, 2019, NM
















# Gender Identity of Current Heroin Users Grades 9–12, 2019, NM

Among the 2.7% who were current heroin users, <u>almost 60%</u> were transgender, genderqueer, or genderfluid.




# Housing Status of Current Heroin Users Grades 9–12, 2019, NM

Among the 2.7% who current heroin users, almost 2/3 (62.9%) were homeless.




# High Risk Groups among High Intensity Binge Drinkers, Grades 9–12, 2019, NM

Among the 3.2% who were high intensity binge drinkers, over 40% had at least one high risk characteristic.




## High Risk Groups among Students who Experienced Sexual Violence, Grades 9–12, 2019, NM

Among the 11.3% who experienced sexual violence, over 50% had at least one high risk characteristic.




## High Risk Groups among Students who Attempted Suicide, Grades 9–12, 2019, NM

Among the 9.9% who attempted suicide, over 60% had at least one high risk characteristic.



## High Risk Groups among Current Heroin Users Grades 9–12, 2019, NM

Among the 2.7% who were current heroin users, almost 90% had at least one high risk characteristic.



## Summary – Risk Behaviors

- All these five groups are at high risk of a wide range of risk behaviors
  - Students not born in the United States
  - Students with physical disabilities or long-term health problems
  - Lesbian, Gay, & Bisexual students
  - Transgender, Genderqueer, or Genderfluid students
  - Homeless students
- Together, these groups make up over 1/3 of all high school students
- Intervention efforts should be inclusive of all these groups.
  - These students include almost 90% of all current heroin users!



### Summary - Protective Factors

Students in high risk groups are less likely than other students to have strong relationships with

- Adults in the family
- Adults in the school
- Adults in the community
- Peers

However, these strong relationships, especially in the family, community, and with peers, are associated with lower rates of risk behaviors for students in high risk groups.

2019 NM-YRRS Results:

#### Tobacco Use Trends

Use of tobacco products during adolescence is associated with higher risk for adverse health effects and lifelong nicotine addiction. The 2019 NM-YRRS asked about current use (past 30-day use) of five tobacco products: cigarettes, cigars, spit tobacco, hookahs, and e-cigarettes (vaping). While use of cigarettes, cigars, hookahs and spit tobacco products have decreased over the past decade, current use of e-cigarettes has increased by 42% since the question was added to the NM-YRRS in 2015.




<sup>\*</sup>Any tobacco use included cigarettes, cigars, and spit tobacco in 2009; cigarettes, cigars, spit tobacco and hookah in 2011 and 2013; and cigarettes, cigars, spit tobacco, hookah and e-cigarettes (vaping) from 2015-2019.

#### All trends in current tobacco use, Grades 9-12, NM, 2009-2019

- Current cigarette smoking decreased by 63%, from 24.0% in 2009 to 8.9% in 2019.
- Current cigar smoking decreased by 54%, from 18.1% in 2009 to 8.3% 2019.
- Current spit tobacco use decreased by 50%, from 11.8% in 2009 to 5.9% in 2019.
- Current hookah use decreased by 59%, from 20.0% in 2011 to 8.2% in 2019.

#### E-cigarette use drove the increase in tobacco use

Current use of most types of tobacco products has decreased substantially over the past decade. However, the overall tobacco use rate among New Mexico high school students has increased, driven entirely by the introduction of and dramatic increase in e-cigarette use.

#### Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance System (YRBSS)

#### 2019 YRBS Results and Data Available Now



The Youth Risk Behavior Surveillance System (YRBSS) monitors six categories of health-related behaviors that contribute to the leading causes of death and disability among youth and adults, including—

- Behaviors that contribute to unintentional injuries and violence
- Sexual behaviors related to unintended pregnancy and sexually transmitted diseases, including HIV infection
- · Alcohol and other drug use
- Tobacco use
- Unhealthy dietary behaviors
- Inadequate physical activity

YRBSS also measures the prevalence of obesity and asthma and other health-related behaviors plus sexual identity and sex of sexual contacts.

YRBSS is a system of surveys. It includes 1) a national school-based survey conducted by CDC and state, territorial, tribal, and 2) local surveys conducted by state, territorial, and local education and health agencies and tribal governments.




