



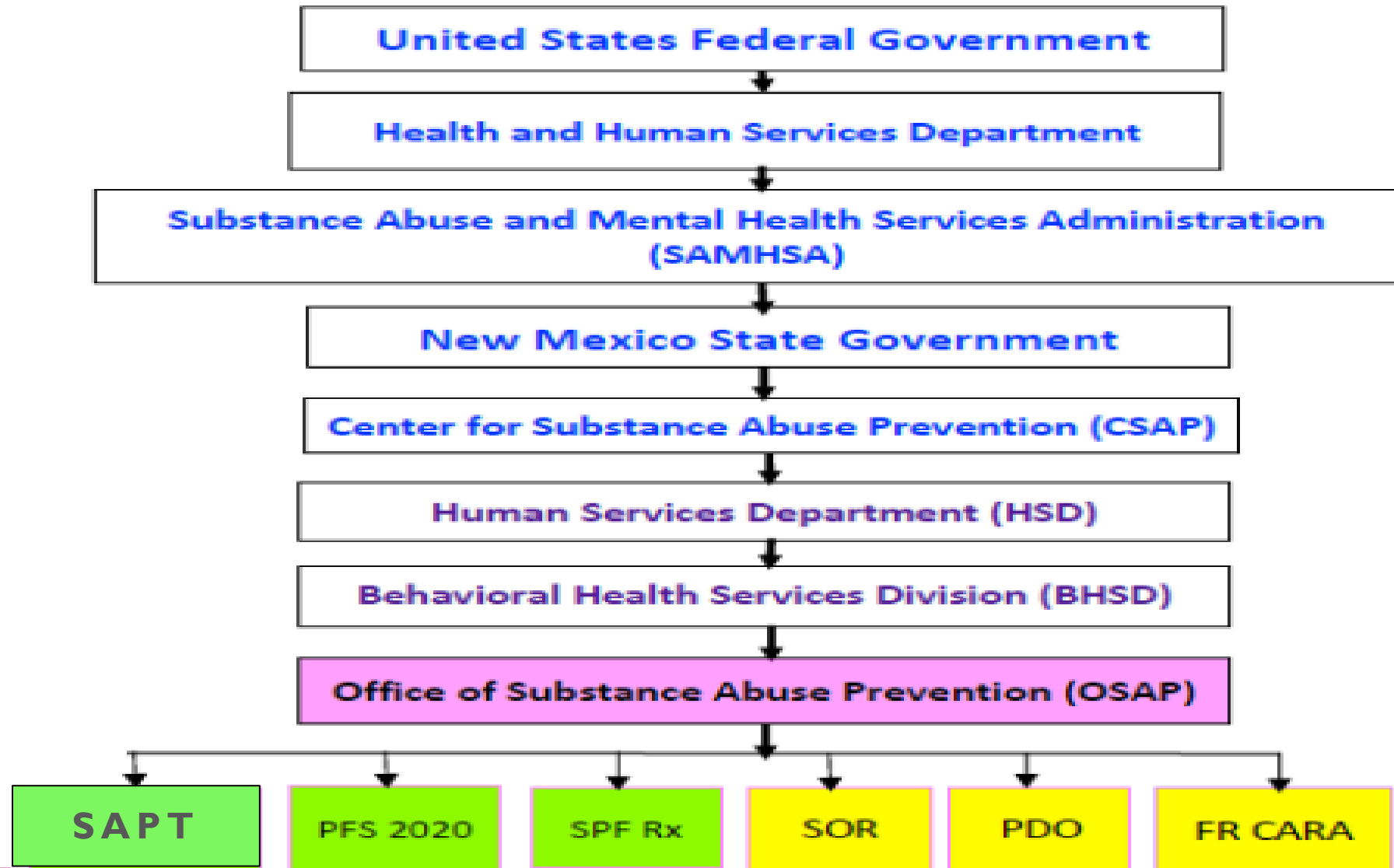

# SAPT - SUBSTANCE ABUSE PREVENTION & TREATMENT BLOCK GRANT

- ◇ Reduces underage drinking
- ◇ Reduces adult binge drinking
- ◇ Reduces adult DWI
- ◇ Reduces prescription opioid and illicit opioid misuse among youth and adults
- ◇ Synar – youth tobacco use prevention

# SPF RX – STRATEGIC PREVENTION FRAMEWORK FOR PRESCRIPTION DRUGS 2021

- ◆ Raises awareness about the dangers of sharing medications
- ◆ Works with pharmaceutical and medical communities on the risks of overprescribing to young adults
- ◆ Uses the Prescription Drug Monitoring Program (PDMP) data

# OVERDOSE PREVENTION

- ◆ Training in preventing and responding to an opioid overdose
- ◆ Distribution of nasal Narcan to professional and community first responders
- ◆ Media to support efforts and reduce stigma
- ◆ Funded with SOR 2020, PDO, and FR CARA grants

## ◆ Since 2017:

- ◆ 768 partners across 32 counties and dozens of partners on tribal nations.
- ◆ 24 of 27 county detention centers
- ◆ 108 local (municipal, town, county) law enforcement agencies
- ◆ 880 reported reversals using BHSD-funded Narcan

**From August of 2021 (our last All Recipient Meeting) through January of 2022, 5,841 persons have been trained in overdose recognition and response, and 10,504 Narcan kits have been distributed.**



# PDO – PREVENT PRESCRIPTION DRUG/OPIOID OVERDOSE-RELATED DEATHS

- ◆ Purpose: Reduce the number of prescription drug/opioid overdose-related deaths for individuals 18 years of age and older
- ◆ Serving Bernalillo, Dona Ana, Rio Arriba and Santa Fe Counties
- ◆ Overdose recognition and response trainings
- ◆ Narcan purchase and distribution
- ◆ Creation and support for Narcan distribution networks

# SPF PFS 20 – STRATEGIC PREVENTION FRAMEWORK PARTNERSHIPS FOR SUCCESS 2020

- ◆ SPF PFS 2020 initiative will address polysubstance misuse with the goal of reducing overdose from the concurrent use of opioids (both prescription and heroin), methamphetamine, alcohol, and/or benzodiazepines.
- ◆ New Mexico will implement a polysubstance use prevention initiative, designed to tear down the common silos that limit flexible responses to what people who use drugs actually experience.

# FR CARA - FIRST RESPONDER COMPREHENSIVE ADDICTION AND RECOVERY ACT

- ◆ Training for professional and volunteer first responders throughout the state to reduce overdose deaths and improve outcomes for survivors
- ◆ Technical assistance for creation of overdose survivor outreach programs
- ◆ Development and support for fire departments overdose survivor outreach programs in Las Cruces and Santa Fe
- ◆ Purchase of Narcan for first responders and overdose survivor programs

# SOR – STATE OPIOID RESPONSE GRANT

- ◆ Reduces opioid overdose related deaths through the provision of prevention, harm reduction, overdose survivor follow-up activities
- ◆ Tribal LEAD Program is pre-arrest diversion for substance use disorders

# TRIBAL NATIONS

- ◆ OSAP works with Tribal Nations across New Mexico on primary prevention to reduce alcohol misuse and prescription opioid misuse and overdose death prevention

# PAX GOOD BEHAVIOR GAME

- ◆ Purpose: PAX GBG is an evidence-based trauma informed care program that utilizes positive reinforcement and contingency management to build self-regulation skills among youth. Served: Students in Pre-Kindergarten through 8<sup>th</sup> grade classrooms through teacher training.
- ◆ Where: 18 School Districts in Albuquerque, Aztec, Carlsbad, Chama, Deming, Espanola, Farmington, Hatch, Las Cruces, Pojoaque, Santa Fe, Socorro, Taos, and Tucumcari.
- ◆ Successes: For FY21, the program trained to 450 teachers, 78 administrators and 351 special staff. 9,426 students were served. Preliminary results show a 49% reduction in spleen counts, impressive for a school year impacted by the pandemic.
