# **DEMOGRAPHICS**

In the New Mexico 2009 Youth Risk & Resiliency Survey, 7,405 Native American students in grades 6-12 ages answered the questions about alcohol use.

# **High School Students**

Female = 1,942 Male= 1,982 Not identified = 9 Total 3,943

## **Middle School Students**

Female = 1,717 Male= 1,735 Not identified = 10 Total 3,462

# **DEFINITIONS**

"Never Drinkers" are students that have never had more than a few sips of alcohol

"Non-Drinkers" are students who drank but not in the last 30 days

"Drinkers" are students have had at least one drink in the last 30 days.

For this report only variables that had a p value of >.005 were used.

If a variable was significant for only one sex then only the results for that sex was reported.



# **OVERVIEW**


Students who use alcohol were more likely to binge drink, be in a fight, consider suicide, smoke cigars, use marijuana and have had sex.

Student who did NOT use alcohol were more likely to think drinking is wrong, have parents who think it is wrong to drink, listen to them, know where they are and have clear rules and standards about their behavior.

Almost half of all students had NEVER had more than a few sips of alcohol




Not surprisingly, the number of students that report never drinking alcohol decreases with each grade. However, there are behaviors that might act as warning signs and protective factors that can help keep Native American youth from drinking alcohol.





# **58% Non-Drinkers: Protective Factors**


- ▶ 89% Adults in community think drinking is wrong or very wrong
- ▶ 94% Parents think it wrong to drink
- 84% Think it's wrong for kids their age to drink
- ▶ 80% Think people risk harming themselves moderately to greatly by drinking 1 to 2 daily
- ▶ 83% Girls have an adult at home interested in their school work
- ▶ 68% Have an adult at home who listens to the problems
- ▶ 86% Have an adult that expects them to follow the rules
- ▶ 87% Girls have an adult who believes they will be a success
- ▶ 67% Have a teacher that cares about them
- ▶ 63% Boys have a teacher who listens
- ▶ 73% Girls have a teacher who praise them
- ▶ 82% Parents know where they are
- 83% Have clear rules about drug and alcohol
- ▶ 84% Have clear rules and standards for their behavior
- ▶ 90% Plan to go to college
- ▶ 61% Involved in school sports/club
- ▶ 46% Girls are involved in community activities


- ▶ 13% Get mostly D's & F's
- ▶ 14% Carried a weapon to school
- Girls 9%
- Boys 19%
- ▶ 58% Were in a fight in the last year
- Girls 50%
- Boys 65%
- 13% Were hit by a girl/boy friend
- ▶ 11% Were forced to have sex
- ▶ 40% Felt sad for 2 weeks
- Girls 51%
- Boys 27%
- ▶ 25% Considered suicide in past year
- ▶ 20% Made a suicide plan in past year
- ▶ 20% Attempted suicide in past year
- ▶ 18% Smoke at School
- ▶ 16% Use smokeless tobacco
  - Girls 6%
  - Boys 26%

- ▶ 38% Smoked Cigars
- Girls 29%
- Boys 48%
- ▶ 52% Tried Marijuana before age 13
- ▶ 88% Have tried marijuana
- ▶ 67% Currently use marijuana
- 30% Currently used Marijuana at school
- 30% Used Cocaine
- ▶ 15% Used Inhalants
- ▶ 8% Used Heroin
- 12% Used Meth
- ▶ 24% Used Ecstasy
- ▶ 29% Used Pain Killers
- ▶ 76% Have had sex
- ▶ 53% Are currently sexually active
- ▶ 54% Skipped or Ditch School

# 84% Non-Drinkers: Protective Factors

- ▶ 96% Parents think it wrong to drink
- ▶ 92% Think it's wrong for kids their age to drink
- ▶ 75% Think people risk harming themselves moderately to greatly by drinking 1 to 2 daily
- ▶ 50% Have a teacher that cares about them
- ▶ 77% Have an adult at home who listens to the problems
- ▶ 64% Have Parents that talks with them
- ▶ 83% Parents know where they are
- ▶ 86% Have clear rules at school
- ▶ 84% Have clear rules and standards for their behavior
- ▶ Girls 62% Involved in school or community sports/club/ activities

# **16% Drinkers:** Warning Factors

- ▶ 17% Get mostly D's & F's
- ▶ 80% Were in a fight in the last year
- ▶ 48% Seriously considered suicide
  - Girls 60%
  - Bovs 34.4%
- ▶ 33% Made a suicide plan
- Girls 43%
- Boys 23%
- ▶ 28% Attempted suicide
- 14% Smoke at School
- ▶ 18% Use smokeless tobacco
- Girls 15%
- Boys 23%
- 34% Smoked Cigars
- Girls 29%
- Boys 40%
- ▶ 66% Have tried marijuana
- ▶ 52% Currently use marijuana
- ▶ 21% Used Cocaine
- ▶ 37% Used Inhalants
- ▶ 6% Injected Drugs
- ▶ 41% Have had sex
- ▶ 24% Have had sex with 2 or more people
- ▶ 41% Friends get into a lot of trouble
