For this report only variables that had a p value of >.005 were used. If a variable was significant for only one sex then only the results for that sex was reported.



OVERVIEW


Students who use drugs were more likely to drink, be in a fight, consider suicide, smoke cigars, smoke at school, and have had sex.

Student who did NOT use drug were more likely get mostly A's & B's, have parents who know where they are and are involved in extra-curricular activities.

> Almost half of all students had **NEVER** tried drugs



Although the percentage of students that never try drugs decreases with each grade, there are behaviors that might be warning signs and protective factors that can help keep Native American youth from using drugs






Native American High School Students in New Mexico

1 in 3 students have been offered or sold drugs at school. Almost half the students say it is very easy to get marijuana




